

INTRODUCTION VIDEO

Before you do your introduction video, please remember that this should be held on the same level as if you are actually going to an interview. This is a life changing video that will take you to a new adventure, but also to a very well-paying position with benefits. You want to be a successful candidate!



- 1: You must look well dressed, neat and clean and presentable.
- 2: you must be in a Well-lit room, no music playing in the background or TV.
- 3: No sunglasses, hat or cap and please be clean shaven or if you have a beard it has to look very neat.

Before you do your introduction video, please remember that phone camera should be held on the same level as if you are actually going to a interview and make sure it's landscape not portrait. Download free teleprompter app for mobile on your phone, copy and paste what you want to say in your video like following

Start the video by saying hello and tell them your name (or tell them you may call me by my nickname) your age and where you come from. Be friendly and catch their attention by being energetic and vibrant (not too much). Tell them in short about your achievements (education background) teaching experience and why you love teaching (what it means to you). You could mention some of the methods you use to teach young children. Tell them why you want to be a teacher abroad.

A successful introduction video must meet the standards set to qualify for the position.



HAVE A SMILE

When you speak, have a smile in your voice (sound professional, but Remember they will be looking and listening to your accent and how you round off your vocabulary. In addition, they will be listening to you with eyes that will imagine you are teaching young minds. Make sure you speak up and can be heard clearly.



IMPORTANT

This is important as 1st impressions last. You want to leave them remembering you in a good way. Please speak slower and be concise. When you end the video, always thank them for their time and that you are looking forward to hearing from them and wish them a pleasant day.

Your video recording cannot be shaky or unstable. Head and shoulder mid-section upwards close up (not from the top of your head or too far away from your face. Directly in front of you would be the best position. You could decorate the wall behind you with children's art or school projects. (colourful is a visual pleasure to them).
